WHAT IS A PAL CARD?

A PAL Card is a Powered Access Licence for operating mobile elevating work platforms (MEWPs) or mast climbing work platforms (MCWPs). To qualify for a PAL Card, operators must complete an IPAF training course and pass a test at an IPAF-approved training centre. PAL Cards are issued by the International Powered Access Federation (IPAF), a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to the safe and effective use of powered access worldwide.







Who needs a PAL Card?

Anyone operating a mobile elevating work platform (MEWP) or a mast climbing work platform (MCWP).

How do I get a PAL Card?

By successfully completing an IPAF course at an IPAF-approved training centre.

What courses are available?

How long is the training?

Courses vary from one to three days duration.

How much does it cost?

Each IPAF-approved training centre sets its own prices. Please contact your local training centre for more details.

Is there a legal requirement for training?

In most countries there is a requirement for operators to be trained before using a MEWP or MCWP.

How long is the PAL Card valid for?

Five years.
